
EU Circular Economy Agenda

EU Circular Economy Package adopted on 2 December 2015

- EU Action Plan for the Circular Economy
- Legislative Proposals on Waste: (WFD, PPWD, Landfill, ELVs, batteries, WEEE)
- A strategy on plastics in the circular economy
- Funding: €650 million (Horizon 2020), €5.5 billion (structural funds)
- Development of quality standards for secondary raw materials
- Ecodesign (promote reparability, durability and recyclability of products, in addition to energy efficiency)
- + Actions to reduce food waste; Revised Regulation on fertilisers; Actions on water reuse



Circular Economy Action Plan – Priorities



Legislative Proposals on Waste: (WFD, PPWD, Landfill, ELVs, batteries, WEEE)

Agreement in December 2017 → New EU waste legislation in force since July 2018



New EU/packaging/SUP waste legislation



+ harmonized calculation methods

New EU waste legislation – other measures

• Separate collection:

- Plastics, glass, metal, paper, bio-waste (by 2023)
- Hazardous waste, textile (by 2025)



• No incineration of separately collected material (unless better environmental result)

• Extended Producers Responsibility:

- Mandatory for packaging (by 2024)
- Harmonised minimum requirements

• Others:

 Fight against marine litter, decontamination to ensure quality recycling, access to information of VHC substances (ECHA database)

1. Introduction


Plastic is an important and ubiquitous material in our economy and daily lives. It has multiple functions that help tackle a number of the challenges facing our society. Light and innovative materials in cars or planes save fuel and cut CO2 emissions. High-performance insulation materials help us save on energy bills. In packaging, plastics help ensure food safety and reduce food waste. Combined with 3D printing, bio-compatible plastic materials can save human lives by enabling medical innovation.




Directive on Single-use plastics (SUP)



Directive on Single-use plastics (SUP)

- **Ban** of certain disposable plastic products
- **Reduction in the consumption** of certain plastic products
- Financing the cost of prevention and cleaning of marine litter by EPR
- For beverage packaging:
 - Collection targets for plastic bottles & caps by 2025 (77%) & 2029 (90%)
 - Obligation of the solidarity of lids and caps by 2024
 - **Recycled material** integration rate:
 - Min 25% in PET bottles by 2025
 - Min 30% for all plastic bottles by 2030.
- Other measures like awareness raising & labelling
